
Saitama Medical Support System

Saitama Prefecture has established a support system to assist people with the payment of medical care and examinations for hepatitis.



▶ Hepatitis Treatment and Care Fees Support System (Apply at: Health Care Centers throughout Saitama Prefecture)
Saitama Prefectural Government will issue Support Recipient Certificates to people who are recognized by the prefecture as having been diagnosed with chronic viral hepatitis or liver cirrhosis. Medical treatment can be undertaken at a personal expense of around 10.000 - 20.000 JPY.



▶ Hepatitis Routine Test Fees Support System
(Apply at: Health Care Centers throughout Saitama Prefecture)
Support payments will be supplied to assist in covering a portion
of medical costs for those who have been diagnosed with chronic
viral hepatitis, liver cirrhosis, or liver cancer, as well as those who
have finished receiving treatment for these conditions. This
payment is provided up to twice per year to people when taking
routine health tests (blood tests, radiography). (Those who

exceed a certain tax threshold are ineligible for assistance.)



Viral hepatitis testing conducted during prenatal examinations, which are conducted to ensure the health of both a mother and her child, is one of the tests performed during the initial stages of pregnancy.

Hepatitis B test (HB surface antigen) and hepatitis C test (HCV antibody) are both conducted.

The hepatitis virus causes **disease in the human liver**. This pamphlet is designed to help you understand how to:

Prevent your child from becoming infected

and

Maintain your own physical health



What does it mean to be positive for hepatitis?

HBs-positive (+) ⇒ Infected with the hepatitis B virus.

HCV-positive (+)⇒ May be infected with the hepatitis C virus.


What happens if I have hepatitis?

Hepatitis B and C viruses are most commonly contracted through contact with blood or other bodily fluids. Also, in some cases, the infected persons may develop chronic hepatitis. Chronic hepatitis is a disease which destroys the cells of the liver, possibly leading to limited movement. Furthermore, chronic hepatitis may progress to cirrhosis (scarring of the liver) and liver cancer. Symptoms may not appear in the case of liver diseases, and the disease may advance before you realize.

Hepatitis B and C are the Root Cause of 60% of All Liver Cancers,

In order to prevent mother-to-infant infection A pregnant mother infected with the hepatitis virus is capable of infecting her unborn child with the virus during pregnancy of childbirth. In order to avoid infection with the hepatitis B virus, which has a particularly high infection rate, the hepatitis vaccine and globulin are administered to children directly after birth. Also, if a mother has sustained an injury to her areolar region (nipples) and/or is bleeding in the area, it is highly advised that she avoid breastfeeding.

*The rate of infection between a mother and her child by the hepatitis C virus is said to be extremely low. However, it is still advised that you consult with a liver/digestive system specialist for a follow-up examination after childbirth.



*If test results for hepatitis B are found to be negative (-) during prenatal examination, children receive periodic vaccination (3 times) against hepatitis B starting from 2 months or more after birth.

Be sure to have medical facility staff record all the tests taken and vaccinations received by mothers and children in the chart below!

Health Maintenance for Mothers

Hepatitis B and C viruses can be eliminated from the body and the progression and worsening of the disease can be avoided using oral medicine and medical treatment (injections). It is very important to receive regular medical care during pregnancy and after birth.

*It is also highly recommended that other persons and family members who live together with you receive hepatitis B vaccinations to avoid infection.

It is important to receive early diagnosis for liver disease so you can begin discussions regarding further in-depth testing and medical treatment.

Please inquire with a medical professional, such as the doctor who performed your prenatal checkup, regarding medical facilities that provide diagnosis and treatment of liver disease. You can use the following resources to locate suitable facilities and medical professionals:
